INFORMATION ON VACCINE REACTIONS

Vaccine reactions fall into two categories:

Mild and common that usually go away in 24-36 hours.

Serious vaccine reactions that require immediate veterinary care.

MILD/COMMON VACCINE REACTIONS THAT RESOLVE USUALLY ON THEIR OWN.

- ❖ Stiff
- ❖ Lethargic - lays around more
- ❖ Sore at injection site or all over
- ❖ Not eating as much
- ❖ Mild fever

SERIOUS VACCINE REACTIONS THAT REQUIRE IMMEDIATE VETERINARY CARE.

- ❖ Repeated vomiting – more than once per hour
- ❖ Swollen face – usually appears first at eyelids and lips
- ❖ Trouble breathing
- ❖ Hives – bumps/welts on body – small or large
